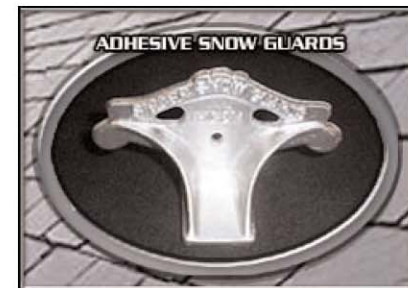

## INSTALLATION GUIDE

1. Place the first row of snow guards in the second course of slate or shingle, beginning from the bottom or eave course.
2. Space the snow guards 1 1/2 to 2 feet apart.
3. Place second row of snow guards in the third course of slate or shingle, above the first row of snow guards, making sure each snow guard is midway between the snow guards in the first row.
4. Place the third row of snow guards in the third course of slate or shingle, above the second row of snow guards, making sure each snow guard is in line with the snow guards in the first row.  
(midway between the snow guards in the second row)

Generally Sieger Snow Guards, Inc. recommends that 25% of the roof be covered by snow guards.

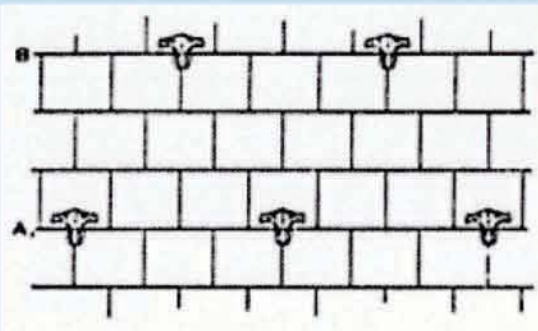
